Hence Animate Projects's decision to take Tate Modern's recent 'Computer Baroque' exhibition and put it online. It's composed of works from the late '80s/early '90s that were devoted to pushing the boundaries of what computers were capable of. In a post-'Toy Story' world, it's hard to be impressed by the graphics (Yoichiro Kawaguchi's 'Eggy' just looks like a Windows screensaver). However, it's easy to admire the spirit behind the sensual maelstrom of works such as 'Neo Geo', where a collage of US pop-cultural icons, political imagery and a post-rock soundtrack create something that could easily have been the inspiration behind Primal Scream's 'XTRMNTR'.
