# '2012': five new artists' animations for Channel 4's Random Acts

Animate Projects is excited to announce five new commissions, in association with Lupus Films, for Channel 4's Random Acts short-form arts strand.

2012 is not only notable as the year the Olympic and Paralympic Games come to the UK. It is also the year that historically many cataclysmic or transformative events have been prophesied to come to pass. We invited artists to respond to these portents of a coming apocalypse, in three minute films. The artists - Oliver Harrison, Max Hattler, Jo Lawrence, Phil Mulloy, and Alan Warburton - take distinct and varied approaches to the theme, exploring ideas of transcendence, extinction, fetishisation, selective vision, chaos and quiet reflection.

The five films are now in production and will be broadcast on Channel 4, randomacts.channel4.com and animateprojects.org from Spring 2012.

# Oliver Harrison - Ode to Apocalypse

A black and white, kaleidoscopic, multi-layered, hyper-kinetic typographical poem, suggesting that a quiet 'apocalypse' has already occurred, that affects us all.

Oliver's films include Love is All, an Animate commission, and winner of several awards at festivals including Oberhausen, Cork and Rushes Soho Shorts. His commercial projects include work for Nike, MTV, Royal Mail, and the titles for Howard's End.

The Banker features Mulloy's regular cast of characters, the Christies, and recounts their encounters with the Mayan End of the World Society (Wellington Green Branch).

He has made over 30 animated films, and has won many international awards include being a three times winner of the Grand Prize for Best Animated Feature at Ottawa International Animation Festival, the largest animation festival in North America.
